1. Participated in Unnat Bharat Gram Aarogya Series

IIT Jammu Participated in Unnat Bharat Gram Aarogya Series session on 26th June 2021, Saturday in Dogri language. The session was taken by the medical experts, Dr. Karunika Sharma (MBBS, MD, PGHHM) Fig-1(b) and Dr. Rakesh Bahl (MBBS, MD, Dp Resp Medicine & Aerospace Medicine Expert Associate Professor, Govt. Medical College Jammu in Fig-1(a)). These medical experts explained about the importance of vaccination and effects of COVID-19 on women health, general awareness about how to treat this disease medically and mentally. 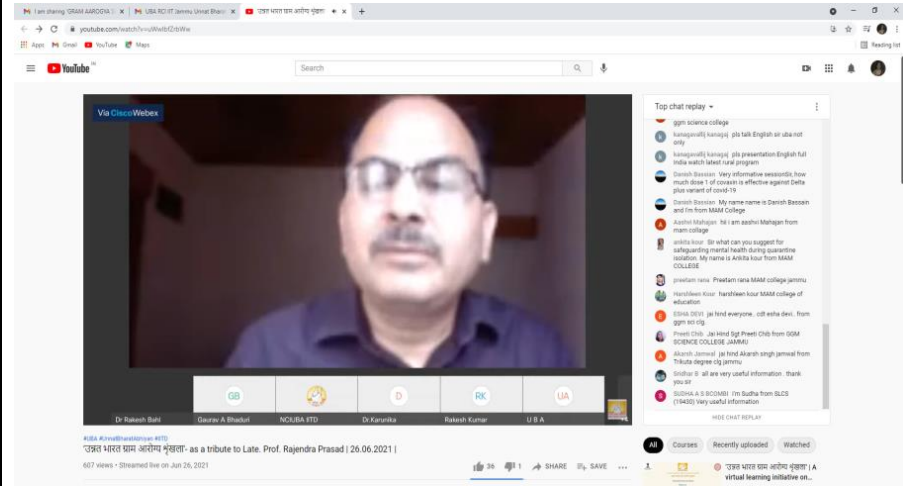

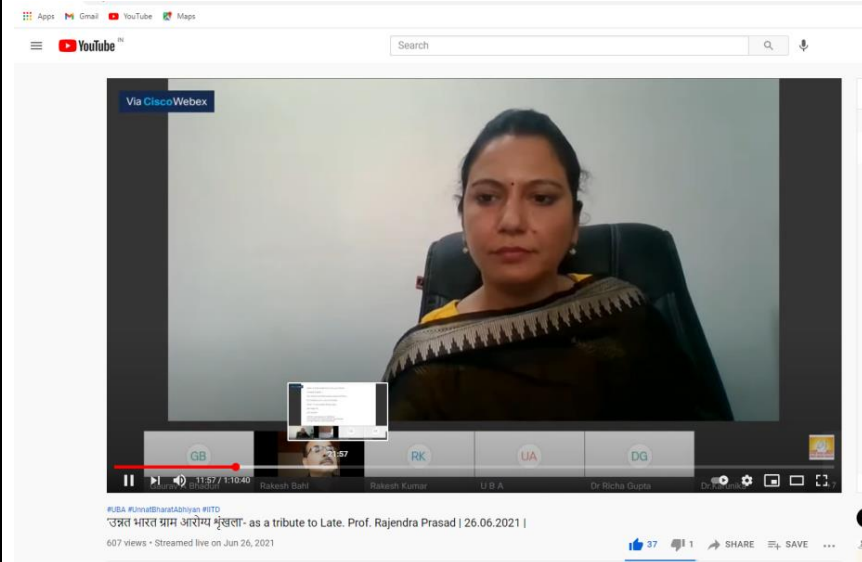

5. Visit to Mooni village

A visit to Mooni village of Tehsil Billawar, District Kathua was planned following on an official request of village pradhan (Sarpanch) Mr. Ramesh Sharma.

UBA wing of IIT Jammu headed by Prof. Rakesh Singhai approached Dr. Sayantan Mondal of HSS Department of IIT Jammu and UBA team for the survey. Ph. D scholars of HSS and Civil Engineering Departments were given the task of survey. The questionnaire prepared by the scholars were inspired from the standard UBA village survey forms to consider the specific needs for the rural areas of J&K region. The request letter from the Pradhan and the team may be seen in Figs. 5 and 6, respectively. It took the team four and half hours from IIT Jammu to the village. After reaching the village, the UBA team got to know that though the village is far off from the town, the village pradhan is motivated enough and wants to implement technical advancements and interventions for the village.

The literacy rate in both male and female is above 80%. The village pradhan wanted the village to be adopted under UBA scheme. The team enquired about the nearby higher educational institution and came to know that Govt. Degree College Billawar is at a distance of 3 kilometres from the village. The team went to visit the institution and briefed them about the UBA scheme. The RCI IIT Jammu is now in the process to register the College under UBA.

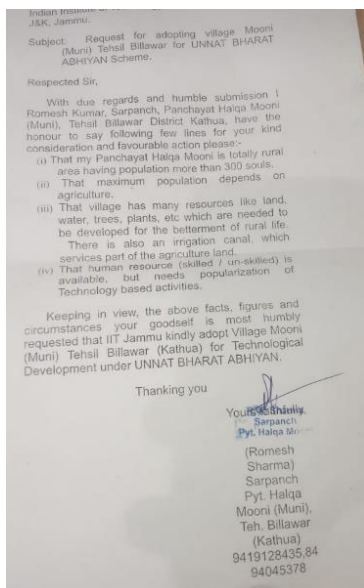

6. Coordinated Tribal Webinars scheduled by NCI



- To plan for the skill program in adopted villages

8. PI Interaction/Review Workshop:

A review meeting was called by RCI Coordinator in hybrid mode (both physical and online mode) on 25th February 2022. Good response was received as 12 participants from PIs attended the meeting in physical mode and 3 attended in an online mode. The glimpses of the event can be seen in Fig-7.

The event started with introduction, followed by lunch. The participants were then taken for Workshop/Lab visit at IIT Jammu. Inaugural session was conducted by Dr. Riya Bhowmik. Framework for preparation of 'Plan of Action' was briefed to the participants by RCI coordinator, Prof. Rakesh Singhai. The emphasis was on the following:

- Involve Panches, Sarpanches, Tehsildar, BDO, Local bodies, etc. in village development plan, village survey and household survey
- Link Govt. schemes with villages----- State and Central schemes
- Encourage SEG Projects Proposals from Faculty as well as students (Customization as well as Development).
- Encourage Internship proposals from villages
- NSS and NCC involvement in villages
- Identify problems in Health, Infrastructure and Education etc.
- Make Proposals on drinking water, waste management, plastic pollution etc.
- Create Self Help Groups (SHG's)
- E-Shram Registration for Un-organized labour of the adopted villages
- Get in touch with NRLM (UMEED) to help the villagers

9) Interaction/ Orientation Workshop of PI's coordinators with Prof. V K Vijay, National Coordinator, UBA

IIT Jammu as RCI, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan organized an Interaction/ Orientation Workshop of coordinators of PIs in Jammu province and Ladakh UT with Prof. V K Vijay, National Coordinator, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, IIT Delhi. The workshop was organized in hybrid mode (both physical and online) in the IIT Jammu premises on 26th March 2022.

The workshop started with the welcome address of Dr. Riya Bhowmik, PI coordinator, IIT Jammu, welcoming the participants and the Chief Guest, Prof. VK Vijay. 6 PI representatives (Prof. Jasbir Singh, Dr. Shivani Sharma, Dr. Bharat Bhushan Jindal, Dr. Palvinder Sharma, Mr. Anirudh Gupta, and Dr. Gurjit Kour) joined the workshop in physical mode. Dr. Gaurav A Bhaduri, Ex RCI coordinator, IIT Jammu graced the workshop and shared his experiences working towards UBA mission during his tenure. Prof. Rakesh Singhai, RCI Coordinator IIT Jammu and 6 PI representatives (Dr. Ajaz Wani, Dr. Manzoor, Dr. Gurpreet, Dr. Suman Bala, Er. Jasdeep Kour, Er. Raman Gupta) joined the workshop in online mode and shared their experiences and proposed work plan for the next financial year.

The focus points of discussion were as follows:

Problems encountered by the PI's and proposed solutions

- Lack of appreciation and motivation for students and faculty participating in UBA related activities. The appreciation could be in form of certification or credit points that may help them in academic upgradation, etc.
- Teaching, social outreach, NSS, and NCC activities need to be streamlined with UBA activities to make it more effective. For its implementation, some circular must come from the ministry through NCI.
- Initiation grant not received by GWC Gandhi Nagar

Achievements highlighted by PI's:

The UBA coordinators and staff from IIT Jammu, i.e., Prof Rakesh Singhai, Dr. Riya Bhowmik, and Mrs. Jeyoti Kaul shared the work done in their adopted villages and Govt. schools through a presentation. In continuation to this discussion, Prof Rakesh Singhai shared the survey experience of Mooni village and wanted a suggestive response on ways to help it become a model village, for example, training unemployed youth, installation of solar street lights etc. In support of training unemployed youth, he shared his experience of training 15 ITI students in the Central Workshop of IIT Jammu who got inducted by Sarasvati enterprise, Bari Brahmana. The enterprise was so much impressed with the quality of the trained inductees that they requested IIT Jammu for more number of trained candidates. Prof. Singhai thus committed in conducting more such training programs under the guidance of NCI.

The work done by other participant PI coordinators was reviewed verbally and suggestive approach was made.

Remedial measures discussed:

- NCI coordinator encouraged the RCI and PIs to interact frequently and develop a support mechanism for sustainable growth.

- RCI would follow up with NCI to help get the initiation grant deployed to GWC Gandhi Nagar.
- NCI coordinator informed that the official notification regarding applicability of credit points for appraisal purposes and appreciation for faculty working for UBA will be shared soon. He also shared that NSS and UBA is going to sign MOU soon.
- It was proposed that RCI, IIT Jammu will offer letter of appreciation to all faculty members who have contributed in UBA related activities since its inception in their respective Participating Institutions in Jammu Province and Ladakh UT.

Post the conclusion of the meeting, the Chief Guest and the PI Coordinators visited the exhibition by Self Help Groups formed under the guidance of UBA, IIT Jammu. The visitors were impressed with the products created by the women members of the SHGs and encouraged them to innovate, design, and create more such products. The SHGs were also encouraged to assess the demand of the local markets and create and sell accordingly. To encourage the SHGs, Prof. V K Vijay purchased a Binna basket and masks. 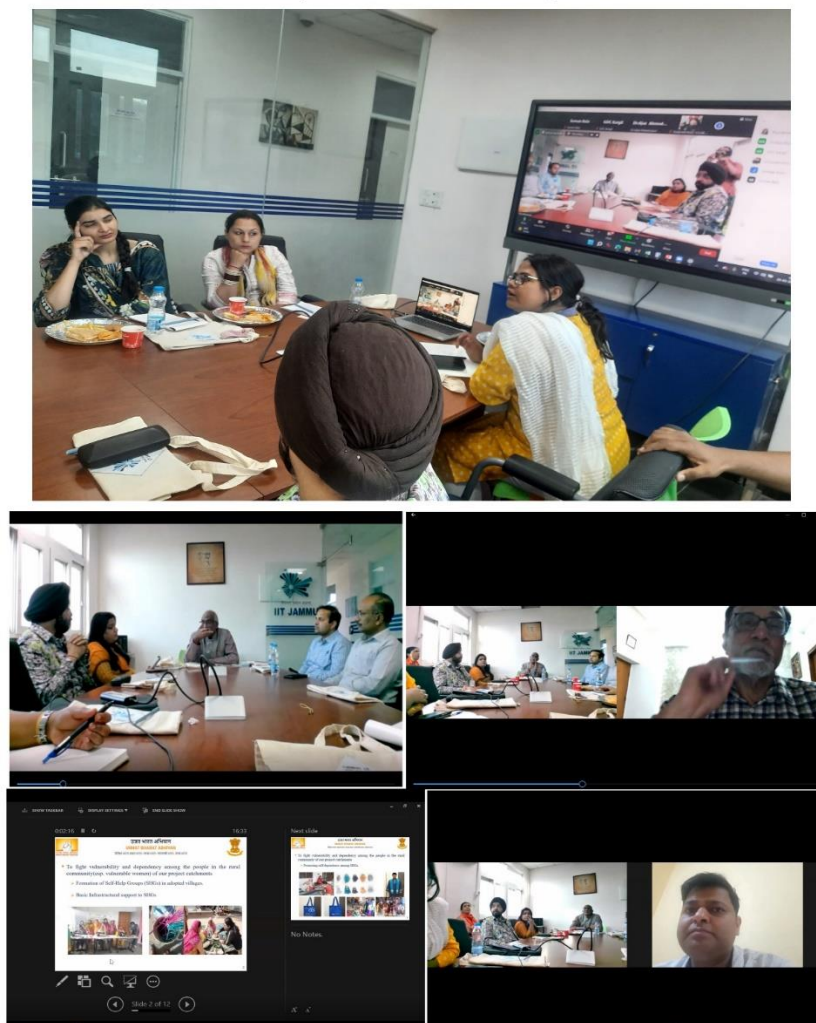

1) Govt. Gandhi Memorial Science College, Canal Road, Jammu

a) Visit to adopted village under UBA (16th July, 2021):-

A visit by the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Team of the faculties from GGM Science College along with NCC SW cadets was organized today to the adopted village Makhanpur in Tehsil Bishnah, District Jammu under UBA mission, and a program by Ministry of Education. The event was organized under the guidance of worthy principal of the college, Dr. Ravender Tickoo and the supervision of UBA Coordinator and Associate NCC Officer Dr. (Capt.) Anjana Sharma. The UBA Mission is to enable higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. The accompanying UBA team members were Dr. Gurpreet Kour, Dr. Lakhwinder Singh (Resident of the Village) and other faculty members from various departments of the college, shown in Fig-8

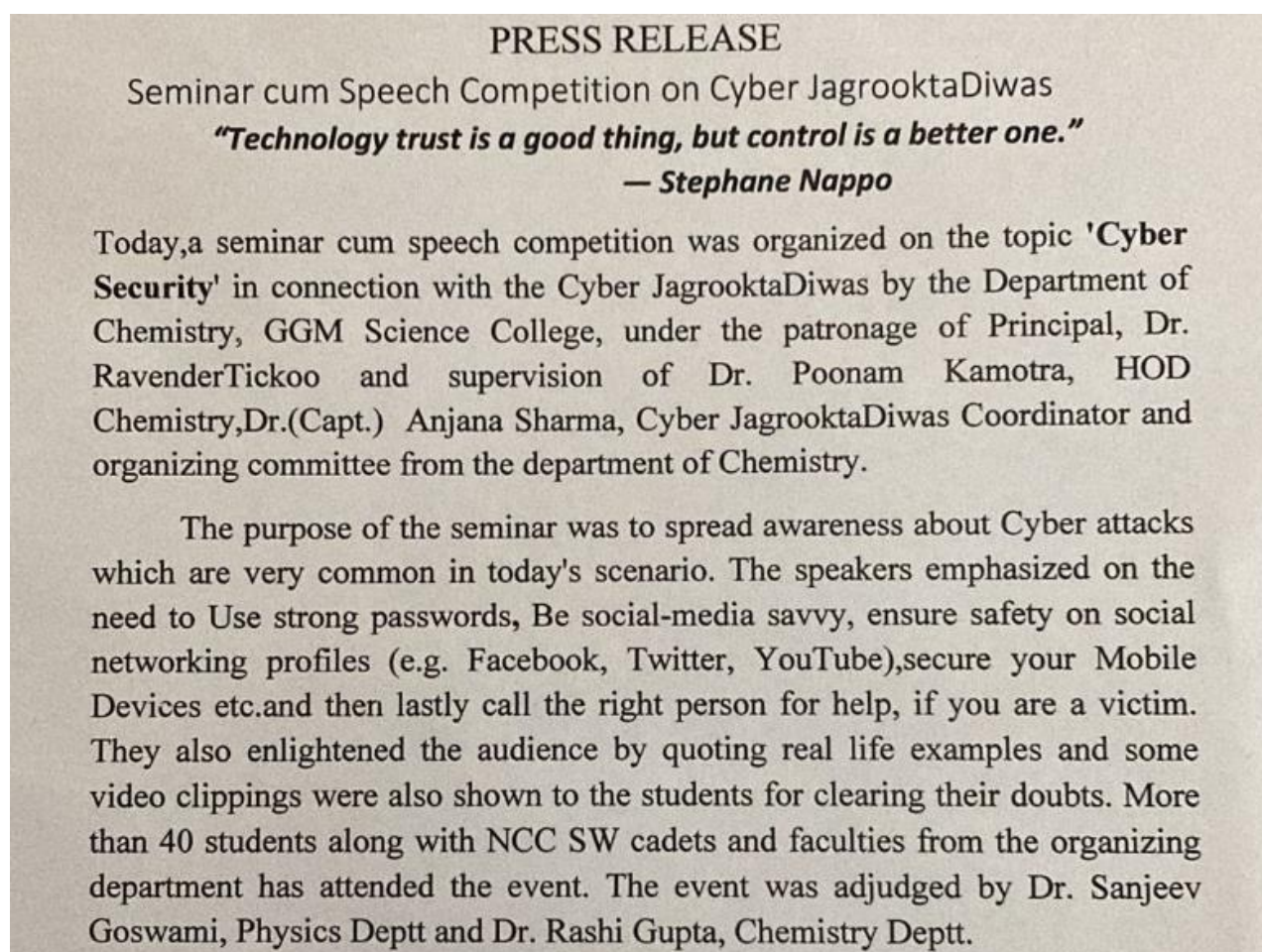

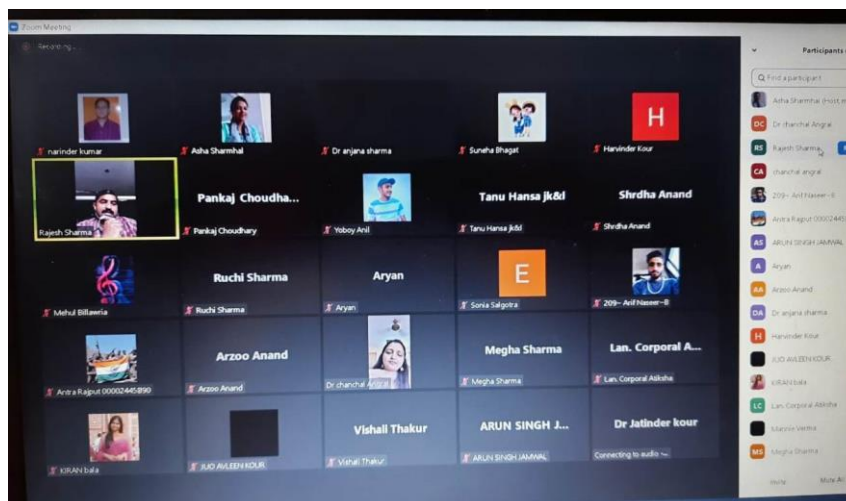

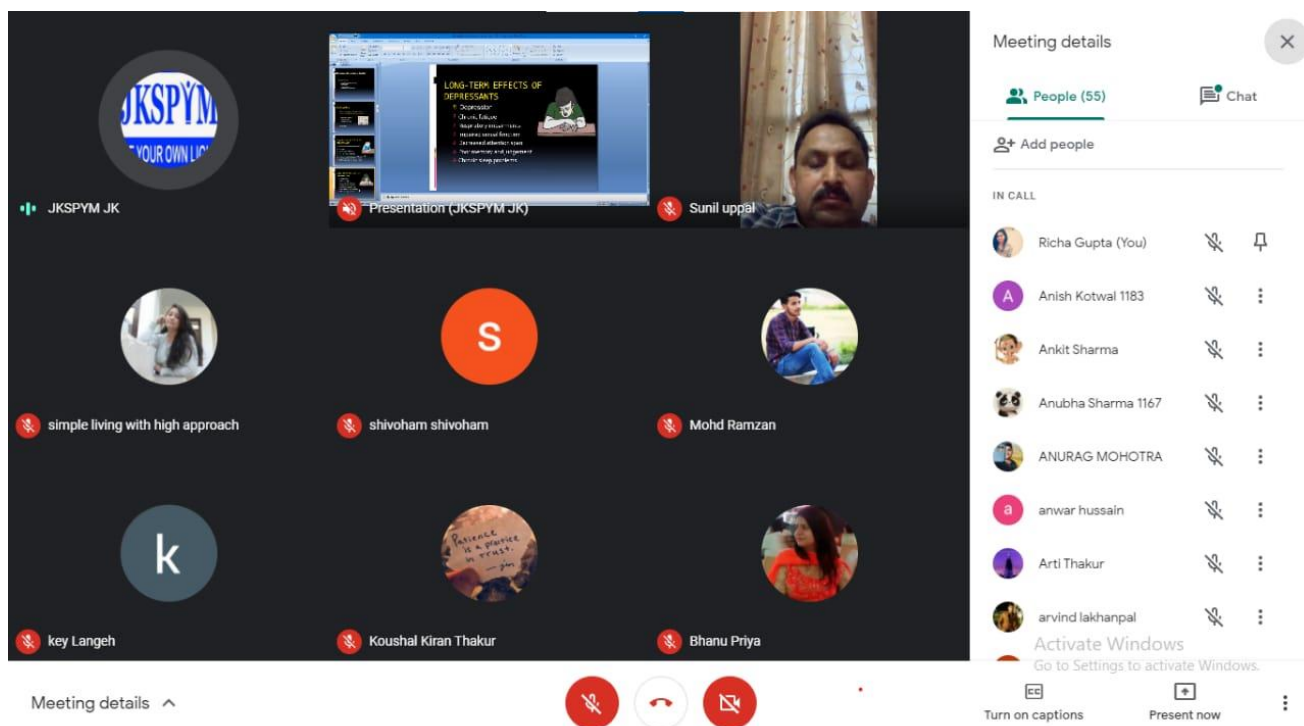

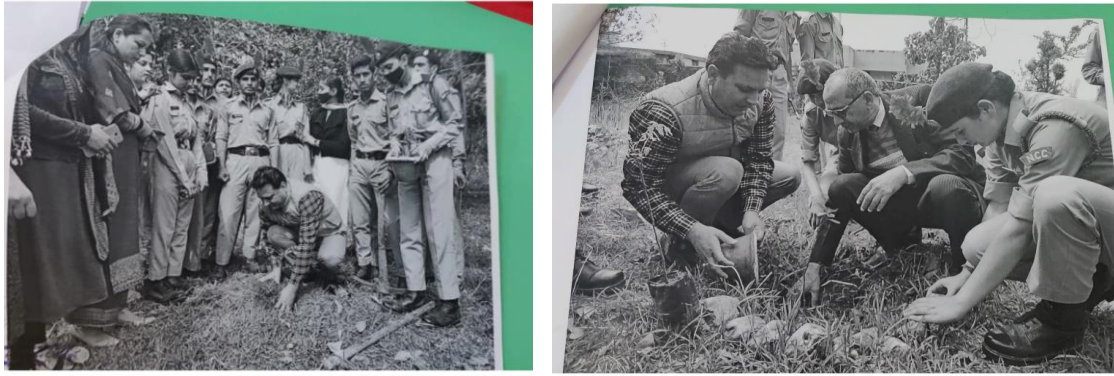

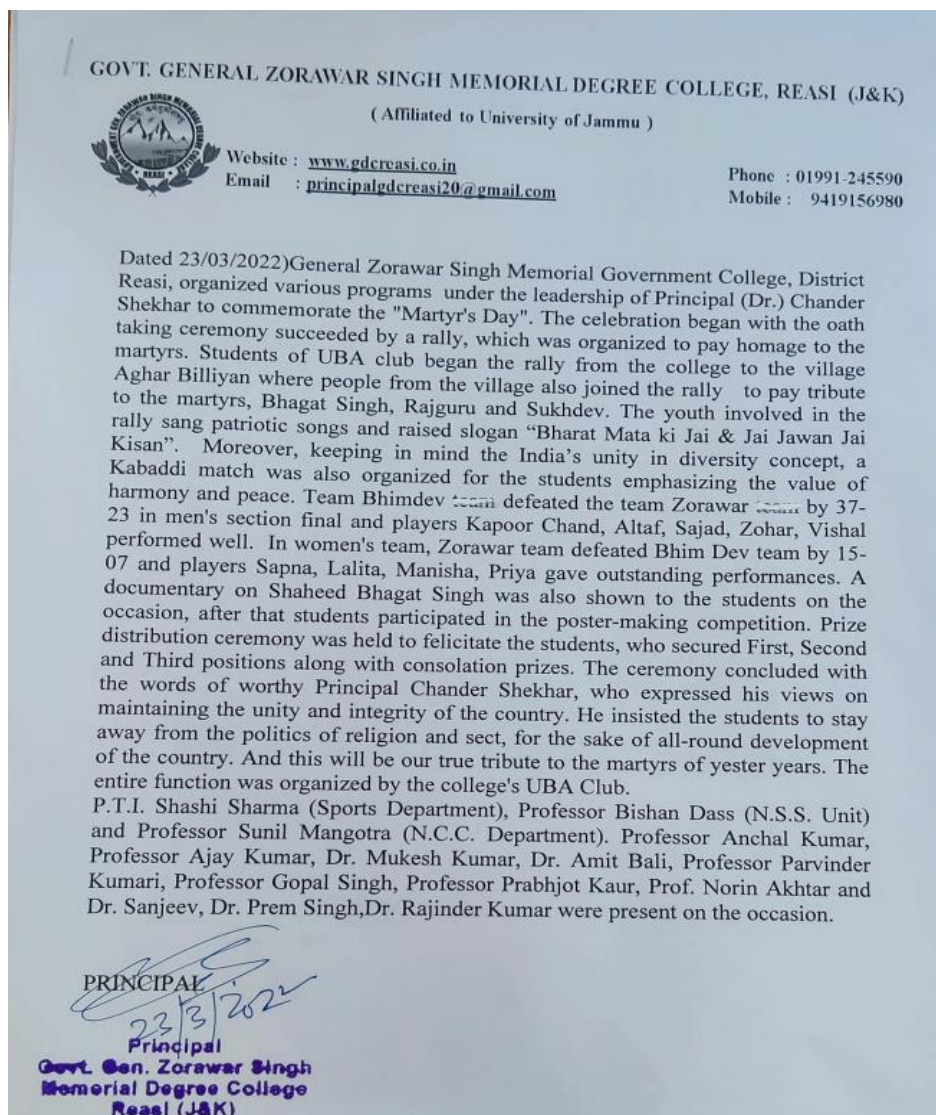

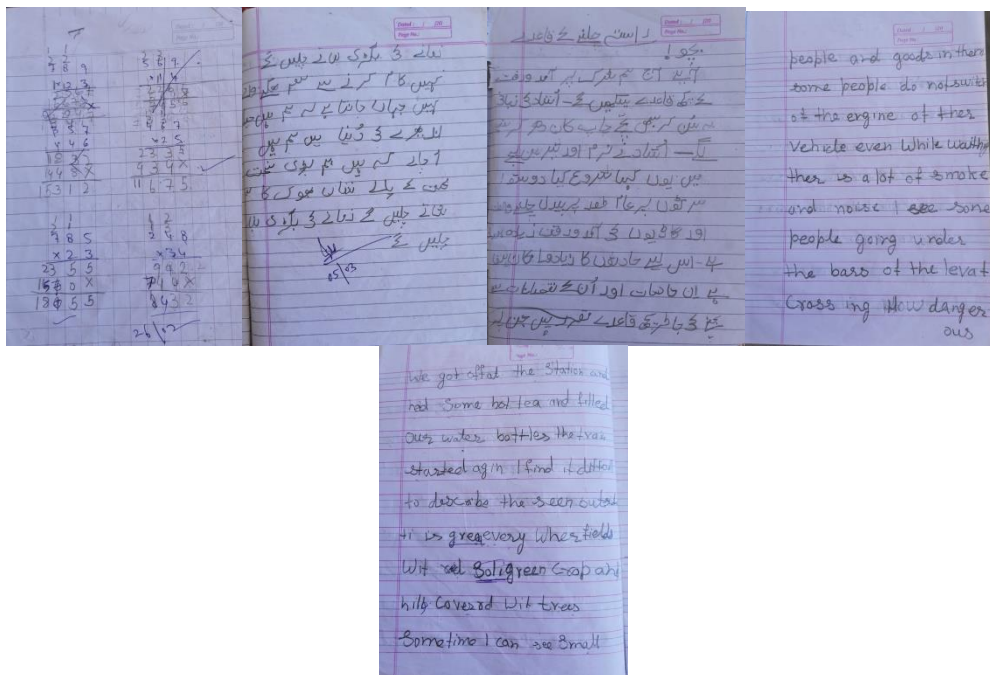

b) Survey Report of Primary School Village Khanpur

A double story school building in a good condition with playground and recreational facility as seen in Fig-28. The school is run by some NGO and the infrastructure for the primary is routed from different government and non-government agencies. The school has student enrollment nearly 150 and above. There are five teachers and one Head mistress.

While interacting, two teachers were seen interested in learning basic computer education, because the school has computer system, but the teachers are not computer savvy. The classes are taken in Offline mode, whenever the relaxation is given, the telephonic messages are circulated and the school starts its functioning. There is no system of online classes. The students pay no fees, but the teachers are on salary.

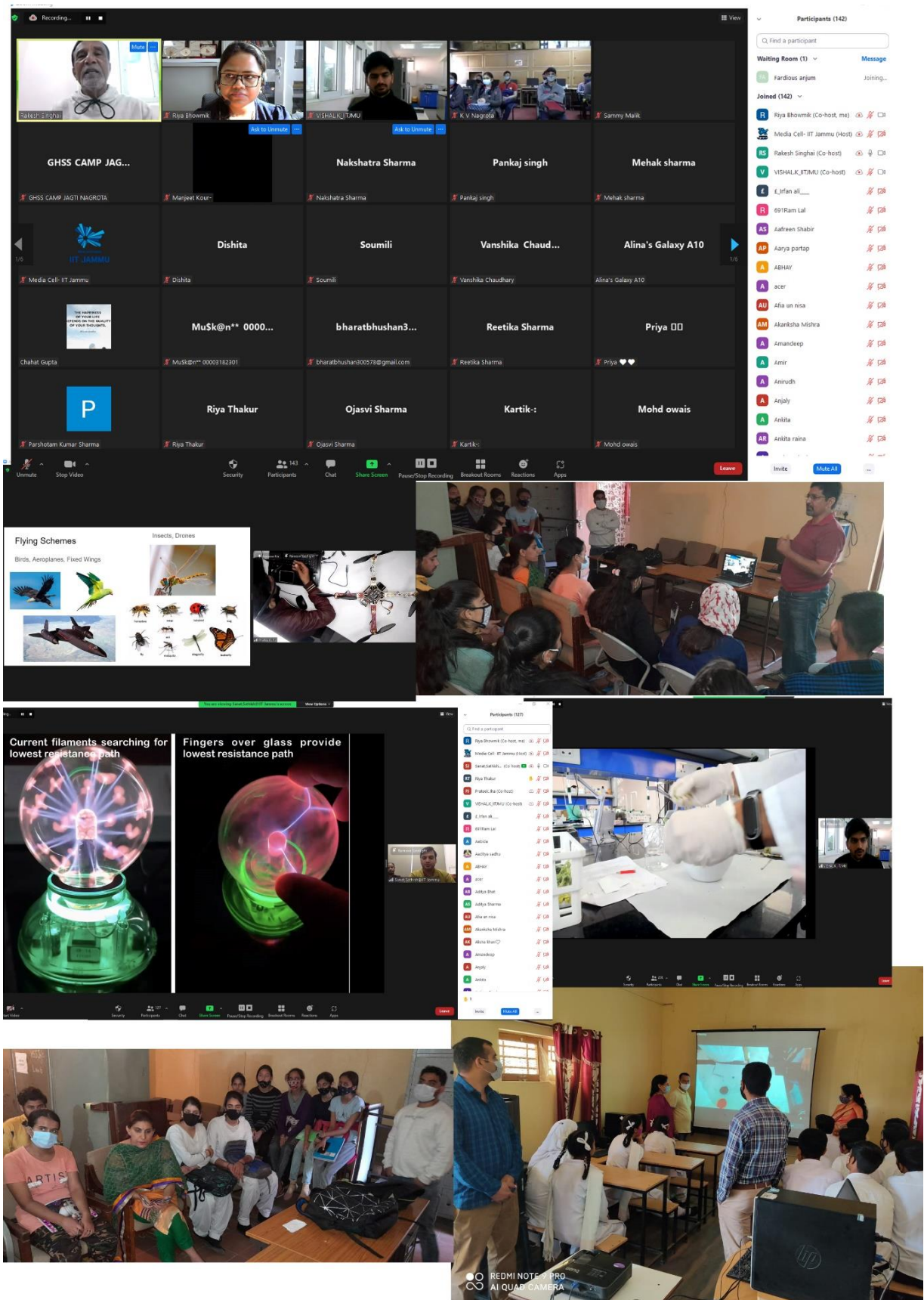


Fig-31 Screen Shots of the Activity

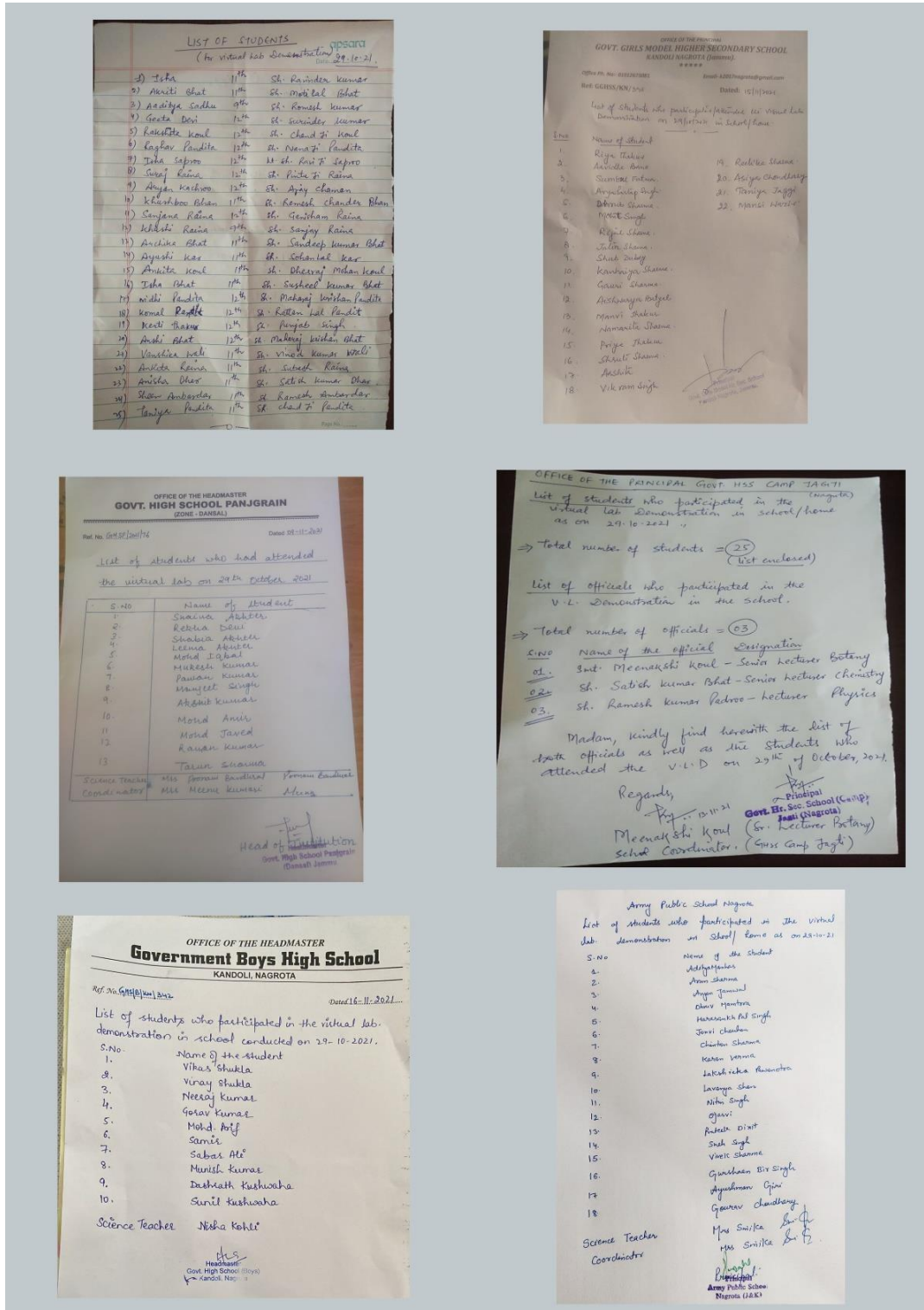

f) Skill Development Program in local village

A two week training program in Binna craft was started on 15th November 2021 in village Tanda of Jagti Panchayat (UBA adopted village) by Office of Continuing Education Program and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan wings of IIT Jammu in association with National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM). The training was imparted in Binna Craft, a local and traditional craft, which has become a dying craft due to the explosion of plastic articles. This craft is made by wrapping method and the raw material used is locally available natural resource, the date leaves (Patha) and the bushy grass. These leaves are sometimes used to dye, just to create design patterns.

There is a customary importance of these articles during marriages even now. The Chabri (big tray) in this craft is used to put the Grooms Sahrah and Brides Chura (bangles) in Dogra marriages. The Craft got its name Binna, as in dogri, the binna means the article to sit on. Earlier the bride used to get these binnas while leaving parent's house and were used as Aasan (seating covers) for performing Pooja etc. But now the Artisans are motivated and trained to create variety of daily utility item in this craft, just to increase demand to generate employment. Daily refreshment was provided to the beneficiaries.

Raw Material Used:

Patha, Dried Grass, Patha Colour

Patha is the local name of date leaf, these leaves are collected and dried in bright day sunlight for 6 to 7 days. Some of the dried leaves are dyed to create design pattern in the articles while weaving can be seen in fig-33 and the glimpses of the activity can be seen in fig-34






